### **NATO Partner Nations**

- On 12 April 2011, the North Atlantic Council (NAC) approved a "Policy for a More Efficient and Flexible Partnership"
- Under that policy, the generic word "Partners" ... refers to the following partnership communities:
  - ➤ The Euro-Atlantic Partnership Council (EAPC) / Partnership for Peace (PfP) Nations
  - ➤ The Mediterranean Dialogue (MD) Nations
  - > The Istanbul Cooperation Initiative (ICI) Nations
  - "Partners across the Globe" also known as "Global Partners"

### **Contact and Other Nations**

- All remaining countries
- \* Including Nations from this group require special requirements/procedures as outlined in the RTA Operating Procedures:
  - ➤ Prior recommendation and sponsorship by a Board Member or Panel Member sponsoring the RTO activity for which participation of a Contact Country national is desired
  - > Agreement by the nation hosting the activity
  - Agreement by the NATO Office of Security and the RTB
  - ➤ Agreement by the NAC via the Political Committee, for Contact Country nationals whose country never previously undertook activities of any kind with NATO



# **Partnership Policy**

- RTO activities can be for NATO only or open to Partners
  - > There is no requirement to include partners in all activities
- Expectation is if an activity is open to a partner nation it is open to <u>ALL</u> partners
- You may still limit partner invitations to less than all partners
  - > Requires justification on limited partnership participation



## **Considerations in Developing TAPs**

#### **Planning Phase**

- For activities open to partners try to include <u>ALL</u> partners
- If there are reasons to limit partner participation justification is required for the approval process
  - ➤ Justification statements should be in the form of why only certain partner nations are invited to participate not why certain nations are not invited

#### \* MD Nations policy

- ➤ Non-discrimination Activities that are open to any MD nation are required to be advertised as open to all MD nations
- ➤ The activity membership can be shaped after the approval process



## **Activity Approval Process**

- Panel/Group approval
  - > Follow your Panel/Group process for activity approval
- RTB approval
  - > RTA OCD will forward activities for RTB approval
- NATO approval
  - ➤ Military Committee Working Group on Cooperation (MCWG-COOP)
  - > Political and Partnerships Committee (PPC)
- Partnership Cooperation Menu (PCM)
  - ➤ Approval tool Partner nations use to develop their yearly RTO Individual Partnership and Cooperation Programmes



## **Post Activity Approval Procedures**

#### **Working Phase**

- Shaping activity membership
  - > Technical Teams may:
    - Apply the "minimum effort" rule to manage new membership or
    - Request Panel approval to close its membership to attending /contributing nations and form a Limited Participation Technical Team (LPTT) in order to exchange sensitive information not releasable to those nations not participating in the Technical Team (\*see RTA Operating Procedures)
- Changing partner participation to an activity beyond the original approved partners
  - ➤ Technical Teams seeking to increase Partner nations involvement must gain unanimous approval from all currently participating nations, approval by the Panel and ultimately approval by the RTB
